COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS

- **3-17, 4-17, 5-17, 6-17** City Engineer Shanayda reported that the Trail Maintenance Project would commence during ODOT's fiscal year 2020. The McCreight Avenue, Deer Road, and Yellow Springs Street projects would commence during ODOT's fiscal year 2021. All the projects require the City to enter into LPA Federal Local-LET Project agreements and Ohio Department of Transportation agreements. All projects required City matching dollars.
- **7-17** Finance Director Beckdahl reported that legislation has been prepared to place an income tax levy on the May ballot. The proposed issue is a temporary five-and-one-half-year levy for an additional four-tenths-of-one-percent tax on earned income. If passed by the voters, the tax would go into effect on July 1, 2017, and end on December 31, 2022. In the tax year 2017, taxpayers would be required to pay 2 percent on earned income for the first six months of the year and 2.4 percent on the last six months of the year, or an average of 2.2 percent for the full year. It is recommended that collection of withholdings at the higher rate begin in July rather than waiting until January of 2018 because revenue is needed as soon as possible. Finance Department staff members will work with employers to ensure that they are aware of the half-year tax increase.

City Manager Bodenmiller stated that collection should begin in July to ensure that essential services continue. If the levy passes, the fire station on Commerce Circle and the police substation will reopen. Funding will also become available for neighborhood streets, and the Police Safe Streets Task Force will be reinstituted.

COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE

- **7-17** Mr. Andy Rigsby, a representative of Firefighters' Local 333, stated he also spoke for police unions and AFSCME Local 1608. He urged the City Commission to vote in favor of placing the proposed income tax increase on the May ballot in order to let voters decide. Vital services are being cut. Violence and drug use are increasing steadily. The City cannot afford to let its coverage lapse.
- Mr. David Estrop, 1736 Audubon Park Drive, urged the adoption of the legislation placing the question of a temporary income tax increase on the ballot. Springfield is in a difficult position. Revenue is needed for the future of our community. Voters need a chance for a second look at this issue.
- **244-16** Mr. Jim Peifer, 20 South Limestone Street, spoke to the annexation of 20.19 acres on East Main Street and stated that City staff members will administer the current township zoning for the parcel, which is light industrial.
- 14-17 Mr. Andy Rigsby, a representative of Firefighters' Local 333, addressed the continuing threat to reduce City employees' benefits and longevity pay. Employees are feeling attacked. Longevity pay is not a Christmas bonus, but a tool for employee retention. Retention is a grave problem for the City. It has lost mid-level and senior-level employees in both divisions of the Public Safety Department. Extensive training is needed before new employees can function at the optimum level. Benefits, such as health care and longevity, help to get and keep quality employees.
- **15-17** Mr. Raymond Upshaw, 325 West Liberty Street, offered comments on the county's criminal justice system.

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There being no further business, on motion of Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. O'Neill, the meeting adjourned.
