111.01 MEETINGS.

The City Hall Forum is the usual place for holding regular meetings of the City Commission.

The meeting following a regular municipal election for newly elected Commissioners to assume the duties of their office shall be held as required Section 14 of the Charter. Other meetings shall be held in accordance with an annual calendar which the City Commission shall adopt by motion. Said motion shall specifically identify any meeting not held on a Tuesday, the Commission's regular day for meeting, or any meeting not commencing at 7 p.m., the Commission's regular time for convening its meetings. The calendar of meetings shall be made available to the public.

The City Commission's calendar of meetings shall comply with the further requirement of Section 14 of the Charter, to assure that the City Commission meets not less than 48 times within any calendar year and with no meeting being more than two weeks following the immediately preceding meeting.

The Commission may determine, by motion, to change the location, time, or date for any meeting on its calendar of meetings, provided notice of the time, date, and place of such meeting is given in accordance with applicable law.

111.02 PROCEDURE FOR LEASE, SALE OR CONVEYANCE OF CITY OWNED PROPERTY.

The City Commission may, by ordinance, authorize the lease, sale or conveyance of any real or personal property owned by the City, when such property is not needed for any municipal purpose, and may prescribe the terms and conditions of any such lease, sale or conveyance. Such lease, sale, or conveyance may be authorized with or without provision for advertisement or competitive bidding at the discretion of the City Commission.

111.03 SALARY OF CITY COMMISSION MEMBERS; COMPENSATION BOARD.

(a) The Mayor of the City shall receive an annual salary effective January 1, 2012, of \$14,330. The Assistant Mayor of the City shall receive an annual salary effective January 1, 2012, of \$11,350. The remaining members of the City Commission shall receive an annual salary effective January 1, 2012, of \$10,750.

(b) The Mayor with consent of the City Commission shall appoint five electors of the City to a Compensation Board which is hereby established. Three members of the Board shall serve for an initial term of two years commencing July 1, 1990, or until their successors are appointed, and two members of the Board shall serve for an initial term of four years commencing July 1, 1990, or until their successors are appointed. Thereafter, members of the Board shall serve for a term of four years, or until their successors are appointed. A member of a City employee's family, as defined in Section 111.04, shall not be eligible for service.

(c) The Compensation Board shall from time to time elect a chairperson from its membership. No person shall serve as a member of the Board for more than two consecutive terms. No person shall continue to serve as a member of the Board who fails to maintain the qualifications of an elector of the City. A person appointed to fill a vacancy to the Board shall serve for the unexpired term of the vacancy.

(d) One member of the Compensation Board shall represent the labor community, one member shall represent the business community and three members shall represent the community-at-large. On or before November 30, 1990, and at least quadrennially thereafter, the Board shall meet to consider the salary and compensation of the Mayor, the Assistant Mayor, and members of the City Commission.

(e) No later than October 1 of each year thereafter that the Compensation Board meets, the Board shall prepare a report to the City Commission setting forth its recommendations of compensation for the Mayor, Assistant Mayor and members of the City Commission. The City Commission shall, within thirty days of receiving the Board's report, either approve it by ordinance or, in the event a majority of the City Commission is not in favor thereof, reject it. The proposal may not be amended or modified.

111.04 MEMBER OF CITY EMPLOYEE'S FAMILY DEFINED.

The definition of *member of a City employee's family* includes, but is not limited to: parents and stepparents, grandparents, spouse, children and stepchildren (whether dependent or not), grandchildren, and siblings, regardless of where they live. Any other

individual related to a City Commissioner or a City employee, by blood or marriage is a *member of the City employee's family* if he or she lives in the same household with the City Commissioner or City employee.
