Your City at Work for You: City Installs Signs to Improve Communication

SPRINGFIELD, OH— (September 28, 2016)—The City of Springfield recently made custom project signs as part of the city's efforts to improve communications about road improvement and utility projects throughout the city.

The City Service Department has a sign shop where the city makes standard traffic control signs and custom signs. Staff has made custom 4'x4' signs that will be installed on road improvement and utility projects to educate and inform the public about those projects.

The signs include the project name, construction award amount and funding source(s). Moving forward, signs will be installed at the beginning of the project and removed soon after completion. Signs that state "PI" are related to the City's Permanent Improvement Funding.

Signs are currently being installed for the following projects:

- Lowry Bridge Reconstruction: \$534,902 - State and Federally Funded
- Burnett Road Reconstruction: \$588,558 - State and Federally Funded
- 2016 PI Paving - Lexington Ave.: \$372,452 - Funded by City of Springfield Permanent Improvement Funds
- 2016 PI Paving - Lowry Ave.: \$48,646 - Funded by City of Springfield Permanent Improvement Funds
- 2016 PI Paving - McKinley Ave.: \$46,582 - Funded by City of Springfield Permanent Improvement Funds
- 2016 Misc. Water and Sewer Replacement - E. Grand Ave.: \$390,466 - Funded by City of Springfield Water and Sewer Funds
- 2016 Misc. Water and Sewer Replacement - Willard Ave.: \$75,384 - Funded by City of Springfield Water and Sewer Funds

"The City of Springfield is dedicated to being financially transparent in what we do with our taxpayers' dollars," said City Manager Jim Bodenmiller. "These signs will serve as a way for our citizens to know what projects we are working on, how much the project costs and how the City is paying for the project. "
