ANSWERS TO COMMON QUESTIONS

1. What will happen at the Community Choices Workshops?

County leaders are committed to an open and inclusive process. The Community Choices Workshops are the second of three rounds of public engagement for face-to-face participation. You will work with others in small groups to rate the draft vision and goals, review plan recommendations, and comment on where and how the County should grow. It's a chance for you to have your say and guide the process.

2. Can I come even if I haven't attended past meetings?

Yes! Your input is crucial at any stage, and now is a great time to get involved. We'll get you up to speed at the workshop about the work that has been done so far.

3. What is a Comprehensive Plan? A comprehensive plan is a strategic guide that expresses the values and aspirations of a community. It is the broadest policy document a community can create to set forth a long-range vision for transportation, economic development and other topics that impact quality of life. It acts as a business plan or guidebook for decision makers.

4. Why does Clark County need to update its

Comprehensive Plan? The existing (1999) Comprehensive Plan needs to be updated to reflect current trends and priorities. Regular comprehensive planning represents good stewardship and establishes a foundation for well-supported policies to create the best possible future.

5. Who is leading the planning process? A citizen steering committee has been established to help guide the public process and the plan's recommendations. Clark County-Springfield Transportation Coordinating Committee (TCC) staff, in partnership with the County and City of Springfield, is working closely with a planning consulting team to facilitate the steering committee's work, convene public workshops, conduct technical work and draft the plan. Public input from the community is also an essential part of the process.

6. What is the timeline for completing the plan? The plan will be completed by the end of 2017.
