City of Springfield Asking Public Input on Street Paving Program

SPRINGFIELD, OH (August 31, 2018) — City of Springfield officials will hold public meetings, asking for resident input on the Neighborhood Street Paving Program.

Officials will host four meetings in September and October to discuss future street paving projects.

“The Neighborhood Street Paving Program is a commitment we made to the people of Springfield with the income tax levy passage in 2017,” said Springfield City Manager Jim Bodenmiller. “As we move forward, it’s important that we have public participation in the process. We want to collect the public’s input on streets that they believe should be considered as part of our paving program. Residents have a right to know how we’re fulfilling the promises we made when voters approved the levy.”
