City Commission to Hear Proposals on Enterprise Zone, Infrastructure, New Equipment

SPRINGFIELD, OH (July 2, 2019) — Measures related to economic growth, street and sewer repair and fire and rescue equipment will go before the Springfield City Commission Tuesday, July 2.

Springfield City Commission will hear a proposal to approve a ten-year, 60 percent Enterprise Zone tax abatement for East College Professionals, LLC. The abatement will allow Stuckey and Troutwine CPAs LLC, The Stuckey Firm, and KB&P Financial Partners to relocate to 49-51 East College Avenue for current and future growth. The initiative is expected to result in 3,000 square feet of additional commercial space for lease. East College Professionals will invest approximately \$665,000.

“This is an exciting proposal for further development in this area of our city,” said Logan Cobbs, Assistant to the City Manager. “East College Professionals is expected to invest approximately \$665,000 in this project, and that’s a significant commitment.”

The Commission will also hear a request to purchase two Stryker Power Pro XT Cots with mounting and loading systems to be installed into two new ambulances to be put into service.

“The new cots are automated and will expedite patient care and improve ease of transport,” said Springfield Fire Rescue Division Chief Brian Miller.

Other items coming before City Commission Tuesday include:

- A measure to authorize a contract with Associated Excavating, Inc. for the Northern Heights Water and Sewer Improvements Project to install 1,346 feet of sanitary sewer, replacing 1,730 feet of 6” waterline and 19 water services and installing 24” x 38” elliptical sewer pipe and junction chamber installation.
- A proposal to award a contract to J & J Schlaegel, Inc. for the Belmont Avenue Reconstruction project between Mitchell Boulevard and Home Road.

Springfield City Commission will meet at 7 p.m. in the City Hall Forum.
