Springfield Police Make Arrests in Two Bank Robbery Cases

SPRINGFIELD, OH (Dec. 5, 2019) — Springfield police have made two arrests in connection with a pair of bank robberies last month.

David M. Judy, 39, of Springfield, was arrested on a charge of aggravated robbery on Nov. 25. He is accused of the Oct. 30 robbery of New Carlisle Federal Savings Bank, 833 Villa Road. Investigators believe that Judy approached a teller with a note that read, “Robbery,” and “I have a gun.” The teller gave the robber the money from her drawer, and then he turned to another teller and said, “Give me all of yours too.” When questioned by investigators, Judy denied being in the bank or anywhere in the Villa Road area.

Brock Lubbers, 31, of Springfield was arrested on a charge of robbery in connection with the Nov. 12 robbery of the International Employees Credit Union, 1427 W. First St. He is accused of passing a teller a note which read, “all the money in large bills.” The robber told the teller to “not push any buttons and to give (him) everything.” The teller complied and the robber fled the bank on foot. On Nov. 27, Det. Ron Jordan executed a traffic stop and found Lubbers in the driver’s seat. A search of the vehicle turned up clothing that matched the description of those worn by the robber on Nov. 12. During an interview at police headquarters, Lubbers confessed to robbing the credit union.

Both men were placed in the Clark County Jail and later pleaded not guilty in Clark County Municipal Court.
