Parking at Downtown Garage is Free Through September

Parking at Park at the 99, Springfield’s downtown parking garage and retail center, will be free throughout the month of September, city officials announced.

“Park at the 99 is a new and very welcome addition to our downtown, and we want to do our part to introduce the convenience of it to the community. We want to give the public a chance to become more familiar with the ease of its use,” said Springfield City Manager Bryan Heck. “The parking garage is just one facet of the overall progress and growth in our downtown as we continue to make our city an even better place to work, live and play.”

Regular rates to park in the garage are \$2 per hour at a daily maximum of \$6; the monthly rate is \$55. All of those fees will be waived so that parking is free to the public throughout September. Normal fees will resume Oct. 1.

Park at the 99 opened in May 2020 less than a year after construction began. The facility includes 305 parking spaces and more than 3,000 square feet of first-floor retail space that faces existing storefronts on Fountain Avenue. Dugan and Meyers, based in Columbus, built the structure.

The \$7 million project was a collaborative effort between the City of Springfield, Clark County, State of Ohio, Clark State Community College, and Community Improvement Corporation.
